

Key Knowledge of Coverall : Test Report ≠ Product Certification

We often hear claims that a coverall is “certified,” but is that truly the case? Many coveralls are only tested, not certified. A Test Report by a local testing agency might show that a sample met certain standards, but this is not the same as full Product Certification such as Regulation (EU) 2016/425 by a recognized body.

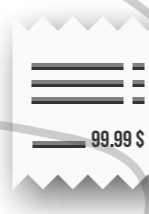


Test Report



BASIC TESTING

Only a few quality samples are sent for testing.



ONE-TIME RESULTS

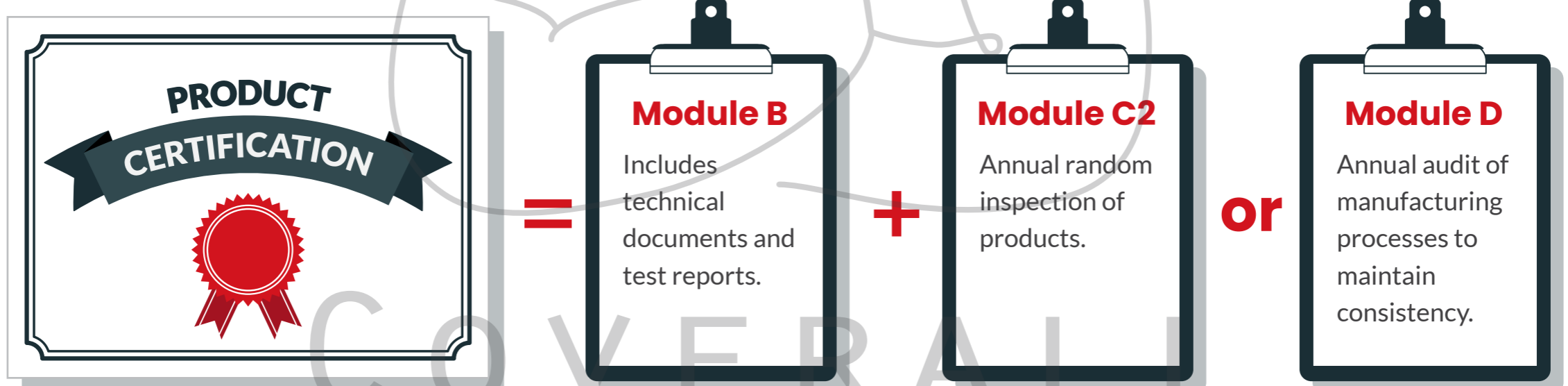
Results are valid only for those samples, not the entire product line.



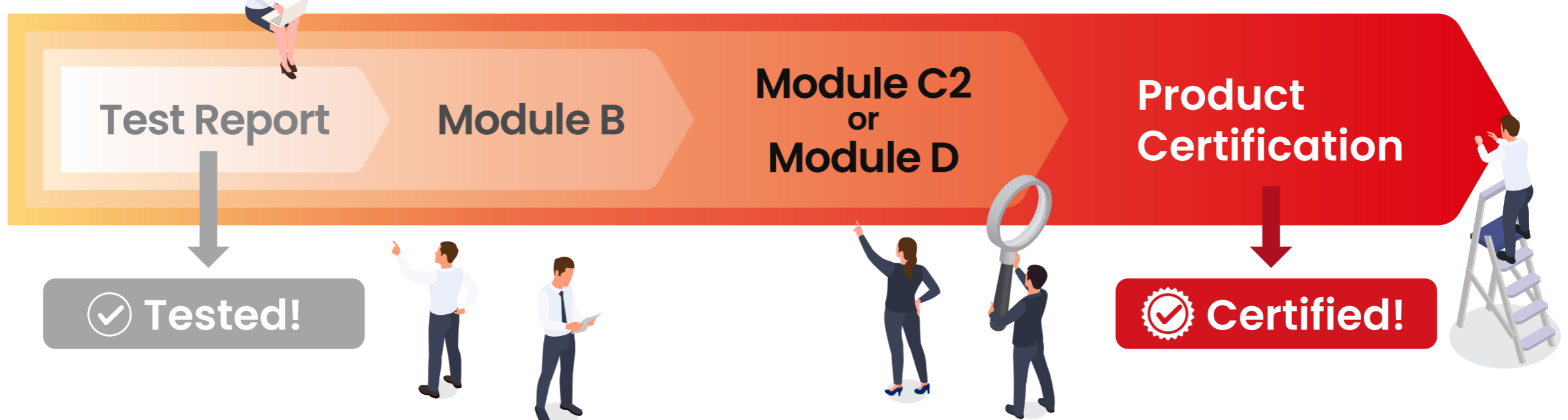
LIMITED ASSURANCE

Lacks batch consistency and guarantees of ongoing quality.

In conclusion, a Test Report is useful for quick quality checks, it does not provide the same assurance as a Product Certification, which guarantees comprehensive safety and manufacturing standards under strict regulatory compliance. Don't be misled—knowing the difference between “tested” and “certified” is key to making informed choices!
